1. The Japanese Placement Test (JPT) 1

- Non-native speakers of Japanese
 - No or little knowledge of Japanese → No examination is required, but must complete a questionnaire in Loyola by 14:00 on April 3 (Mon) → See pages 2-3 of the JLP booklet.
 - A little or more knowledge of Japanese →
 Must take Japanese Placement Test on April
 3 (Mon) at 13:30 on 4th floor of Building 6. Be
 sure to bring a pencil, eraser, and your ID
 card to the test. ⇒See page 2 of the JLP
 booklet.

1. The Japanese Placement Test (JPT) 2

- Native speakers of Japanese (usually refers to those whose parent(s) are Japanese and communicate with him/her in Japanese)
 - ■Take the test for native speakers ⇒ See page 3 of the JLP booklet.

- Check the test result, or the class placement for JPN111: available after April 7 (Fri) 13:00 on the Loyola university bulletin board: Enter "Result of the JPT" in the Keyword box.

- Attendance is essential for language courses, as students are expected to actively participate in and accomplish in-class assignments and activities.
- •Attendance is counted from the first day of class: April 11(Tue)

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5. Tracks 1

Pages 11 to 17 of the JLP booklet

- ●Regular Program (レギュラープログラム)
 - Beginner's and two intermediate (JPN200, 211)
 - 5 (100 min) classes a week
 - Other intermediate and advanced
 - 4 (100 min) classes a week
- Specialized Japanese Courses (Business, translation, etc.)
 - -2 or 1 (100 min) class(es) a week

5. Tracks 2

- Intensive Program
 - 10 (100 min) classes a week
 - 9:00 to 12:35, Monday through Friday
 - 8 credits, each class gives you a lot of work; oral communication, critical reading, writing, analysis of Kanji, etc.
 - If you would like to deepen your understanding of the Japanese language and culture, the Intensive Program (IP) is the right choice, but very HARD!!!
 - It is not recommended to take three or more courses other than the Intensive course.

 (Primarily for native speakers)







- You need <u>10 CONTACT HOURS of class per week</u>,
 (6 class periods/wk) to meet the visa requirement.

 Some courses have prerequisites. Please check the course syllabus carefully.

 FLA Core Program courses, courses in Studies in Christian Humanism, and Language courses except Japanese are NOT open to exchange students.
