However, you may face unexpected family circumstances or unforeseen financial and social situations that make it difficult for you to continue studying at university. The scholarship system is provided to support you at such times.

Sophia University offers many scholarship programs for various cases with different conditions. This brochure will help you find the most appropriate scholarship program for your needs. Please check LOYOLA regularly as other updated information will be posted on the bulletin board. If you have difficulties selecting the appropriate program or any other inquiries, please feel free to visit or contact the desk for Financial Support at the Center for Student Affairs (1F, Bldg.2).

We hope that the scholarship programs will be used to support as many students as possible and help them lead a productive and rewarding campus life.

Introduction

(1) Purpose of Scholarships

We offer financial assistance to students who are facing financial hardship that may make it difficult to continue their studies, even though they have a high academic performance. We provide partial donations or loans for the tuition fees to those students. Our goal is to help these students devote more time to their studies and enjoy their university life without worrying about financial constraints.

(2) Applying for Scholarships

Each scholarship has its own criteria for application and selection, and the numbers of recipients are limited, so there may be cases in which students are not accepted, despite meeting all the criteria. Before applying for a scholarship, please consider your living conditions carefully, discuss it thoroughly with your family and think carefully about which scholarship to apply for.

(3) Application Preparation

Scholarships must be applied for by the student him/herself, and the grant or loan will be awarded to the student him/herself too. Students must consider their financial situation before applying, and must prepare all necessary documents. Students may be asked detailed questions about their financial circumstances at the interview, so please talk to your family beforehand so that you can provide accurate information.

(4) If Your Family's Financial Situation Suddenly Changes

If the main earner in your family loses his/her job or passes away, or if a disaster or some other circumstance causes a sudden change in your family's finances, which makes it extremely difficult to continue your studies, you can ask us for help at any time.

(5) Selection Criteria

With the exception of Sophia University Academic Excellence Awards and some Sophia University Benefactors' Scholarships, the criteria for selection are financial hardship and good academic performance, with a particular focus on financial hardship.

In terms of the level of financial hardship, students are unlikely to be selected for the Sophia Tuition Support Scholarships if their family's annual income exceeds ¥7 million or if their family has business income exceeding ¥4 million (It depends on each family's situation).

In terms of academic performance, students whose grades do not meet a certain standard may not be selected regardless of the level of financial hardship. We hope that Sophia University's scholarships will lead to an improvement in recipients' grades.

2. Outline of Scholarship Program

Scholarships consist of an Application-based type and a Recommendation-based type. The former is the one students can apply for through the Center for Student Affairs. The latter is recipients are decided by the President of Sophia after a recommendation from each faculty or graduate school followed by deliberations with the Committee for Student Affairs.

Sophia University Scholarships All grant-type scholarships

(1) Sophia University New Student Scholarship/Graduate School New Students Scholarship

This tuition reduction scholarship is the very first one students can apply for, which is awarded to students whose first choice of university is Sophia University.

Submission should be completed during the same period as the application for enrollment.

(2) Sophia University Tuition Support Scholarship

This tuition reduction scholarship is for undergraduate/graduate students, which lasts for a year. Students can apply for this scholarship every year.

(3) Sophia University Benefactors' Scholarships

This type of scholarship is awarded by benefactors within Japan and from overseas.


Scholarships without mark **I** or **I** are available for all students.

⟨Regarding receiving of multiple scholarships⟩

It is possible to receive multiple Sophia scholarships as long as the total amount cannot exceed the tuition and fees for the academic year. However, it is not allowed to receive multiple tuition reduction scholarships such as the New Student Scholarship and Tuition Support Scholarship.

As for external scholarships offered by public or private organizations, they have different policies. Please check the application requirements before applying.

(Process from Application to Granting)



All notifications on scholarship applications are announced on the **Loyola** Bulletin Board.

Please download the guidelines/application forms.

Be sure to check the announcements; the download period may differ by each scholarship.

The deadline must be met. Late applications will not be accepted. Read the guidelines thoroughly to prepare all documents required. If you cannot prepare all the documents due to unavoidable reasons, please consult the Center for Student Affairs before the deadline for submitting the papers.

Some scholarships have interviews for selecting recipients/ nominees. Please be sure to check the date, time and place of the interview. If you miss the interview, you will be disqualified (nomination will be cancelled for external scholarships).

Results of screening will be notified (for external scholarships, the nomination will be notified) as an individual notice on the Loyola Bulletin Board.

For external scholarships, the nominees will be selected, and the scholarship organizations will selecte recipients.

They will have their own selection process, application papers and may conduct interviews, so check the instructions given by the Center for Student Affairs and the scholarship organizations.

Benefit/loan type scholarship payments will be made through bank transfer to the student's bank account. For recipients of the tuition reduction scholarship, the scholarship amount will be deducted at payment of tuition.

*Depending on the tuition payment status, we may transfer the scholarship directly to the recipients of the tuition reduction scholarship through your bank account.

Necessary Documents for Application

The required documents vary depending on the scholarship, so please refer to the application guidelines for more details. Generally, the following documents are required.

1) Scholarship Application Form

You must submit one for each scholarship you apply for. Please fill in the form, detailing the reason for your application.

2) Report on Living Conditions

Please fill out this form, detailing your family's current circumstances. If it is discovered that a scholarship student has purposely omitted any necessary information or provided fraudulent information, scholarship payments will cease and the student will be required to return the money, so ensure that the information provided is accurate.

3) Academic Transcript

You will need to provide a transcript of grades received at this university as well as prior grades if applicable.

4) Certificates of Income

You must provide proof of your income and that of any family members mentioned in the Report on Living Conditions, including your father, mother, spouse, siblings. However, providing proof of income is not required for financially independent family members. For details, please refer to the application guidelines. If you or someone in your family is receiving income from overseas, you must provide an official statement from the country. If another person is supporting your household in place of parents or other family members, you must provide proof of that person's income.

If you are receiving unemployment benefits, welfare benefits, a family pension, or disability benefits, please provide copies of the related documents. You may also need to provide other documents depending on the situation.

5) Others

In addition to the above documents, other documents may be needed depending on the individual status of the student or family members (rental agreement for students commuting from outside their home / Disability Certificate etc.). For detailed information, check the application guidelines for each scholarship program.

Scholarships Available for Japanese Students (Including International Students Who Don't Have a "Student" Status of Residence)

1. Sophia University Tuition Support Scholarship

(Criteria)

This scholarship is for undergraduate and graduate students experiencing financial hardship that makes it difficult to continue their studies despite tremendous motivation. Students are unlikely to be granted this scholarship if their household income exceeds 7 million yen (including tax) or their business income exceeds 4 million yen.

- *If you study beyond the standard residence requirement and receive a tuition reduction for having less than 12 credits to graduate or thesis, you are not eligible for this scholarship.
- *You cannot receive any other tuition reduction scholarships while receiving thie scholarship.

- ·It is recommended that you apply for the ③Atutumn Application if you wish to receive the scholarship for the following academic year, although you can apply for the ①Spring Application.
- •Regarding the ①Spring and ②Autumn Applications, you need to pay the original tuition fees for the first semester once.
- ·All current students include Undergraduate Students, Graduate Students, Course of Midwifery Students, and Transfer/Second-degree/Re-entry Students.
- •Students who exceed the minimum required residence can apply for the scholarship after graduation is postponed.
- · Students studying abroad (excluding a privately-financed study abroad program) can apply for the scholarship. Your scholarship status remains the same while studying abroad.

(Regarding leave of absence)

- Scholarships will be cancelled if a recipient requests a leave of absence during the term.
- Students are not allowed to apply for any scholarship during a leave of absence. Please apply for scholarships once you return to the university for the latest information.

2. Sophia University Benefactors' Scholarships

These scholarships are offered by benefactors in Japan and overseas to all degree students. There are two types of scholarships: one is the scholarship that students can apply for through the Center for Student Affairs (direct application). The other is which recipients are decided by the President of Sophia after a recommendation from each faculty or graduate school followed by deliberations with the Committee for Student Affairs (recommendation-based).

The scholarship is valid for one year, but students may be selected again. As a rule, receving multiple scholarships is allowed up to a maximum amount equivalent to the tuition and fees for the academic year.

6. Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO) Scholarships

Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO) is an independent organization that provides general support for Japanese national students and some foreign nationals with a specific visa status. The organization provides scholarship loans for students with excellent grades who are experiencing financial difficulties that make it difficult for them to continue their studies, in order to contribute to the growth of individuals who have the potential to make a valuable contribution to the government or society, and to help provide equal opportunities for education.

This scholarship loan is given by JASSO, and comes in two forms, Type I (interest-free) and Type II (with interest.) Those selected will receive monthly stipend until they graduate or leave the university. They must repay it after graduation by a pre-determined method.

(2) Scholarship Loans While Studying Abroad

(Exchange Program / General Study Abroad)

Generally, Students can receive a mountly stipend. Also, they can increase their loans before studying abroad.

(Study Abroad on a leave of absence)

Generally, the payment is stopped while the recipient is on overseas study program. However, if the recipient submits a request and JASSO approves it, the scholarship may be paid during the overseas study. If you wish to make the request, contact the Center for Student Affairs (Financial Support Section) in advance.

(3) Procedure after Selection

Students selected as recipients of the JASSO Loan Scholarship Program, excluding recipients of emergency loans, will receive scholarship loan payments from the time they are selected until graduation. The following procedures are necessary.

(4) Repayment

JASSO scholarships are loans and must be repaid after graduating or leaving the university. There is a repayment briefing session held in the Autumn Semester of the student's final scholarship year. The repayment process begins after graduation or after the student leaves the university.

(5) Repayment Exemption for Graduate Students with Excellent Achievements

Graduate students who received a JASSO Type I (interest-free) scholarship and have excellent academic achievements may apply for the Repayment Exemption Award. Application details will be announced on Loyola Bulletin Board in December.

7. External Scholarships for Japanese Students (Offered by Public/Private Organizations)

Outside Sophia University, there are a number of external scholarships provided by local governments and private organizations, foundations and corporations. Students can apply for these scholarships through the Center for Student Affairs. Conditions such as application procedures, target students, selection criteria, number of recipients and amounts vary depending on the organization.

- For some scholarships, students need to be nominated by the university. However, it doesn't guarantee the acceptance of the scholarship, as the nominated students also need to pass the selection by the provider of the scholarship.
- Students selected for external scholarships are expected to consider themselves representatives of Sophia University and behave in a suitable manner for a scholarship recipient and work even harder at their studies.
- Students who are already nominated by the university for one of the external scholarships cannot be nominated for another.

(Application Process)

University-Recommended – the university takes applications and selects candidates to nominate to the organization.

University-Coordinated – students submit applications to the organization through the university.

Direct Application – students submit applications directly to the organization.

(Eligibility)

Eligibility and conditions differ according to the organization, so for details please check the information on Loyola.

8. Scholarships for Study Abroad

The University requires the Overseas Travel Alert issued by the Foreign Ministry of Japan (MOFA) to be lower than Level 1 for all students to join on-site study abroad including privately-funded study abroad. The conditions and acceptance of applications for the study abroad scholarships could change depending on the situation. 1. Procedures for International Students at Sophia University

1) Obtain a "Student" status of residence.

Consult the Immigration Bureau for information on this procedure.

2) Submit proof of "Student" status of residence.

Students are required to submit their "Certificate of Residence" and a copy of both sides of "Residence Card" to the university at the time of enrollment with the application papers. If you extend your "Student" status of residence or change to a "Student" status of residence from a different status during your time at Sophia, submit it to the Center for Academic Affairs (Counter No.4, 1st floor, Building No. 2).

[Note] If the status of residence you have submitted to the university has expired, you will not be eligible for any international student scholarships.






