Course Description	In this course, students will explore the relationship between the Japanese language and Japanese culture. The Japanese language encompasses pragmatics, sociolinguistics, and more, while culture encompasses Japanese customs, way of thinking, and more. This course combines lectures, discussions, written reports, and presentations. Students will not only learn through instruction but also from one another by actively participating in the exchange of ideas and opinions. Students are encouraged and expected to share their opinions, personal experiences, and views actively in class.
Course Objectives	By the end of this course, students are expected to be able to understand the Japanese language beyond grammar and vocabulary, and the relationship between the language and culture of Japan.
