The ability to understand the approaches and overall theory of International Relations Studies and Area Studies and consider issues from both perspectives combined.

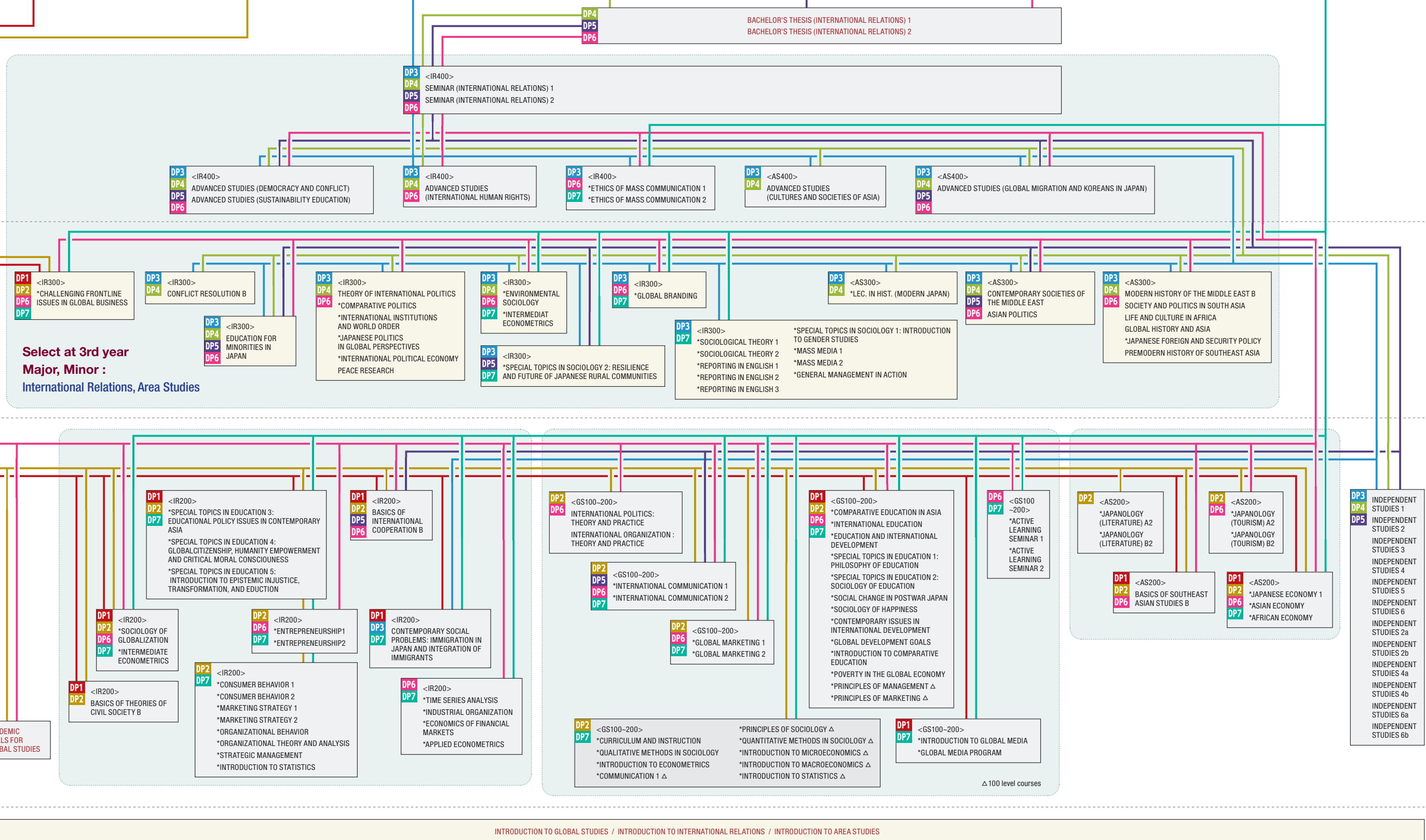
DP3
