<b>Course Description</b>	This course, which is designed for students with no background in Japanese, mainly focuses on spoken Japanese used in daily life. The course introduces basic sentence structures, vocabulary and common expressions as well as the writing system (hiragana, katakana, and some kanji).
<b>Course Objectives</b>	This course aims at developing basic communication skills in Japanese. By the end of this course, you are expected to handle daily conversation and read and write simple texts in Japanese.
<b>Expected work outside of class</b>	Reviewing materials, doing homework assignments, preparing for quizzes and the final examination Length of time for work expected outside per class is 90 minutes.
